The tourism and outdoor recreation industries are growing. TRAL graduates are leaders, educators, and entrepreneurs in our most important natural spaces. Educate others about the natural world, lead life-changing adventure opportunities, and create new businesses based on sharing the outdoors.

Learn how to manage public lands including national parks and forests as well as private lands – basically anywhere people recreate. Outdoor Rec students go on to work outdoors for public agencies like Nat'l Parks or the U.S. Forest Service, or local governments or parks and recreation.

Your Bachelor's Degree (BS) in TRAL



- A minimum of 180 credits are required for graduation; 60 must be upper division (300 and 400-level courses).
- A maximum of 135 credits earned at a community college may be applied toward a bachelor's degree at OSU.
- Only courses with letter prefixes and numbers above 100 are accepted.
- TRAL students must complete 6 months of work experience related to their degree.
